Chapter 1 Discussion Sheet: "I Wonder" Questions

Use these questions after viewing or reading Chapter 1. They are designed to move beyond recall and help children think about curiosity, responsibility, nature, and what it means to notice the living world more carefully.

Questions for Discussion

1

I wonder why the tree appears upside down - is it showing that something in nature has been turned the wrong way by human choices?

2

I wonder why Crypt comes from inside the tree instead of from somewhere far away - does that mean the problem begins close to home, in our own yards and habits?

3

I wonder what it means that the roots are searching for minerals, water, air, and other things they need, but the world beneath them is no longer cozy or right.

4

I wonder why the boy has to look more closely before the adventure can begin - what are people missing when they only glance at nature instead of really seeing it?

5

I wonder what Crypt means when he says the place around us is starting to stop being able to grow - and what responsibility people have once they understand that?

Suggested Use

Invite students to choose one question, talk about it with a partner, and then draw or write one response. The goal is not one correct answer. The goal is thoughtful noticing.

Teacher / Parent Note

These questions support the central idea of the opening adventure: Crypt is the "CReature You Put There," a guide who helps children consider how people may be responsible for environmental problems - and how paying attention is the first step toward repair.
