## Field Missions Preview Set

This preview page shows how the **badge / certificate system** can support the Season 1 Field Missions. Children can earn an episode badge as they complete individual missions and a season-level badge and certificate as they complete the full journey.



**Episode Badge Example:**  
Up-Trunk Observer

Rewards completion of the opening mission and introduces careful noticing close to home.



**Episode Badge Example:**  
Bee Friend

Rewards the beehive mission and highlights pollinators, flowers, and habitat awareness.



**Season Badge Example: Season 1 Completed - Crypt Field Observer**

This badge represents completion of the full Season 1 field-mission journey. It can be used alongside the certificate as a larger symbol of observation, stewardship, and growing environmental awareness.

# Season 1 Completion Certificate Sample

A season certificate gives families, teachers, and children a tangible way to celebrate completion of all ten field missions.



### Certificate Purpose

The certificate can be awarded when a child completes the full Season 1 Field Passport or the complete set of ten missions. It works especially well for homeschool families, classrooms, library programs, and reviewer demonstrations.

# Sample Episode Mission Page

Example from Season 1: Episode 3 - Under Water

## Badge Goal

**Water Guardian** - This sample mission is different from the badge examples shown in this preview. It demonstrates the kind of page that could appear in the 10-page Season 1 mission booklet.

## Crypt's Mission

Water is everywhere, but people do not always notice where it travels or what happens when it becomes polluted. For this mission, become a **Water Guardian** and pay close attention to the water around you.

<b>1. Watch</b>	Watch Episode 3, <i>Under Water</i> .
<b>2. Notice</b>	Look for water in your world: a puddle, stream, rain barrel, birdbath, sink, hose, ditch, pond, or watering can.
<b>3. Record</b>	Write or draw <b>three things</b> you noticed about the water or the place around it.
<b>4. Reflect</b>	Think about who or what depends on that water and how it might be harmed if it became dirty or disappeared.
<b>5. Act</b>	Choose one helpful action: turn off running water, pick up litter, water a thirsty plant carefully, or tell an adult if you notice polluted runoff.

## Questions to Consider

- Where did you find water?
- Did it look clean or dirty?
- What living things might depend on it?
- What is one way you could help protect water where you live?

When a child completes this page, they would earn the **Water Guardian** badge in the full badge set. The same page structure can be repeated across the 10-episode Season 1 mission booklet for a uniform and themed experience.
